FGHC often hosts service groups from elementary schools, high schools, and universities. In this issue, we would like to highlight the service group from Pius XI High School.

Tom Holschuh, campus minister at Pius, says their students come from all over southeastern Wisconsin - from the inner city to the suburbs.

"The service experiences give them an opportunity to see parts of the city that they haven't been to before," said Tom, adding "it's important for them to get a sense of their community and what the needs are."

Pius requires students to complete service experiences in four categories: family, community, vulnerable populations, and environmental.

By volunteering at FGHC, students learn about the community we serve. Our clients are dealing with poverty, homelessness, addiction, and mental health issues, among others. Serving at FGHC also gives the students



an opportunity to reflect on the environmental impact of clothing.
